Update on security ...

We had planned to go live with the updated ANPR on 5th August but due to a technical issue, we have had to delay this until Wednesday, 28th August. The issue is unrelated to the new cameras or technical equipment which is working fine, it's due to our IT infrastructure and communication speeds which is being updated this week.

Testing is continuing and you will see the team monitoring entrances during the day and the Response Centre overnight. We will continue to capture data of authorised and non-authorised vehicles throughout the coming months to increase our database size, visibility of movements and traffic flow and importantly our ability to identify and act on individuals not approved that pass through or onto the Estate.

We will be setting up a number of Zoom/Web meetings later this year where we will invite residents for an update on progress and a short Q&A.

Events in Moor Park...

Sunday morning 4th August numerous residents were surprised to see professional-looking cyclists racing along Sandy Lodge Road and Sandy Lodge Lane. The race was part of a Triathlon event.

MP58 has now reviewed its policy and have decided that there will be no future third party events held on the Estate. One exception is the the charitable 10K and Fun Run which is a longstanding event and will still go ahead. Events like the Litter Pick, Christmas Fair and Carol Service bolster our community spirit and are encouraged to continue.

10K and Fun Run - Date: Sunday 22nd September 2024.

Charity: significant fundraising event for Mount Vernon Cancer Centre and the Lynda Jackson Macmillan Centre

The 10k run starts at 3.00 pm at Merchant Taylors' School. It is anticipated that there will be 600 runners in total in the region, finishing back at Merchant Taylors' School by approximately 5.00 pm. The run uses the facilities of Merchant Taylors' School and the roads in the Moor Park Estate and Moor Park Golf Club.

Marshals will supervise every junction on the route to ensure that the race takes place safely and with the minimum disruption to traffic. Most of the marshals are residents who have supervised the junctions before and are thus very experienced. However, the organisers are looking for additional volunteer marshals – typically this would involve you for about 2 or 3 hours on the day. Contractor Parking during building work

There has been an increase of builders' vehicles parking on the roads resulting in unacceptable congestion on the Estate roads. If you are having building work on your property, please note that only two vehicles are permitted to park on the road in front of your property at any one time. It is the resident's responsibility to communicate this restriction clearly to their builders and provide adequate parking for them during works. This restriction is clearly communicated to residents both in the Members Handbook and the Consent In Principle that is signed by the resident together with the Levy Fee request. Charges will be made against the levy refund should these rules be ignored. In addition, please remind your builders that permitted working hours are: Monday to Friday 8:00am-5:30pm and Saturday 9:00am-1:00pm. No work is permitted on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
