# Estate Managers Report ...

#### Bin It, Don't Block It

#### Parking

Please remember that there is no resident parking on the private roads. Please ensure you park on your driveway and any visitors to your property display a note on their dashboard with details of who they are visiting should there be no space on your drive to park.

#### Roads

We have scheduled repairs to the carriageways on Sandy Lodge Lane, Askew Road, Thornhill Road and Temple Gardens 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> March.

The works on Sandy Lodge Lane and Askew Road will be outside of rush hour and school drop off/pick up times. All roads will remain open with restrictions.

# We have scheduled repairs to the carriageways on South Approach and Russell Road 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> March:

#### South Approach – Monday 10th March

The road will remain open for resident access however the section of Westbury Road between the tunnel and South Approach will be closed and it will not be possible to enter or exit the Estate via Westbury Road during the day.

#### Russell Road – Tuesday 11th – Wednesday 12th March

We will be resurfacing Russell Road between Batchworth Lane and 56 Russell Road. The entrance to Russell Road from Batchworth Lane will be closed for two days. Resident access to Old Gannon Close and Russell Close will be maintained however some disruption is likely. There will also be a small repair on Old Gannon Close and Russell Close.

Additional road repairs are proposed for the Easter Holidays and further information will be provided once the works are scheduled.

## Knight Security Update...

- Attended School/Station 1530 following a mugging incident to provide security presence and support.
- Conducted testing of rat runner alerts at MTS to assess system effectiveness. Activated all the alerts on the officer's phones to ensure quick response.
- Responded to multiple reports of vehicles obstructing the road, ensuring appropriate action was taken.
- Issued parking notices and reported incidents to the Estate Office for further action.
- Distributed informational letters to residents on the estate regarding relevant security and community matters.
- Engaged with contractors regarding concerns over lorry movements, illegal burning of building materials, noise disturbances, and improper parking.

- Carried out regular patrols to maintain site security and deter potential issues.
- Addressed concerns regarding a gas company knocking on residents' doors to inform them of upcoming work.
- Throughout January 2025, we recorded 176 vehicles attempting to access the estate at night. Many were turned away due to the absence of a valid reason for entry, ensuring the estate remains secure and reserved for authorised users.
